<b>Eligibility of beneficiary institutions</b>	<p>Two different FFG funding instruments are available for applicants from Austria:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Transnational Cooperative R&amp;D Projects (Kooperative F&amp;E-Projekte - Transnationale Ausschreibungen)</li> <li>• Transnational Cooperative Projects of Oriented Basic Research (Kooperative Projekte der orientierten Grundlagenforschung - Transnationale Ausschreibungen)</li> </ul> <p>The organisations which are eligible for funding, as well as the eligibility criteria for cooperation are listed in the national guidelines available via the national Call website (<a href="https://www.ffg.at/europa/jpi_mybl_call2017">https://www.ffg.at/europa/jpi_mybl_call2017</a>).</p> <p>If more than one Austrian applicants are participating in the same transnational proposal, only one funding instrument can be used for both of them.</p>

<p><b>Submission of the proposal at the national level</b></p>	<p><b>Austrian applicants have to submit also nationally via the FFG eCall: <a href="http://ecall.ffg.at/">http://ecall.ffg.at/</a></b></p> <p>The national Call closes on <b>4 April 2017, 17:00 CEST</b></p> <p>Failing to comply with the abovementioned deadline and the detailed requirements of the eCall application procedure, will result in the application to be considered ineligible!</p> <p>After the deadline FFG will conduct a formal review of all nationally relevant project proposals including the examination of the application formalities, especially the fulfilment of prerequisites specific to the offered funding instruments; examining the financial aspects of the proposal; financial viability of applicants.</p>
